Registration has Closed. Now what?

Congratulations on making it to States for National History Day in New Hampshire! We are so excited to see you and your project!

Registration begins at 7:30am and Judging begins around 9:30am. Please see our [website](#) for details. Specific location and time of judging for each project will be distributed at registration.

PSU will not require a parking permit for competition this year. Please plan on parking in lot #304 just off High Street and behind Hyde (the building where all categories except exhibits will present). If you cannot find space, you may also park in lots 301, 214, and 408. You can find maps and updated information on our website.

There will be plenty of down time throughout the day, so please plan accordingly. Documentaries, websites, and performances are open to the public during judging if you care to attend. Papers and exhibits are closed to the public during judging but will be open to the public during select periods during the day.

As you know registration is closed. We ask you to be patient with us as we coordinate the student and judge schedules for the day of competition.

Judge Information

Judges,

Thank you so much for volunteering to judge at this year's state competition! We are so grateful for your support and commitment. History Day has so much to offer students in regards to engagement in history, thesis development, and communicating in different ways, and your involvement makes the experience possible.

For many of you, this may be your first time judging. We want to prepare you with all of the information you will need to be successful and comfortable on the big day! Our judge coordinator, John, will be contacting you to give you some preliminary training for the event. We will also let you know your judging groups (you will judge in groups of three) and the category which you will be judging (ie. Documentaries, papers, websites, performances, or exhibits). If you have a preference on which format you judge, please email me and let me know!

The competition runs all day long. We will need you to arrive here, at Plymouth State University, at 8:00am. We will meet in the University HUB (Hartman Union Building), which is in the center of campus. You can park in the Hyde lot (#304, near building # 28 on the campus map). To access parking go straight up the hill out of the turn circle upon entering town from Route 93.

Before the event we will give you further instruction on how to judge and the nuts and bolts of the experience. You will have an opportunity to meet other judges and have any questions answered. The first round of competition starts around 9:30am.

We will be providing you with all the writing materials and forms you will need, as well as lunch and items such as coffee. Please dress professionally.
